build update 14 New Homes in Stoke

n the next 12 months, Habitat Nelson will build 14 homes on a large section at 623 Main Road in Stoke – 12 townhouses will be home ownerships and 2 social rentals. There will be 2 one-, 6 two- and 6 three-bedroom homes which will provide decent and affordable housing for low to moderate income families through Habitat's rent-to-buy scheme - the Progressive Home Ownership (PHO) Programme. A townhouse community is being developed with the benefits of shared spaces and support in a central location surrounded by a good range of family facilities (playground, barbecue area, a shared workshop and garden with bike and car parking).

Habitat Nelson has received over \$3m share of a \$13.8 million interest-free government loan to Habitat for Humanity New Zealand. This 15-year loan from the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development (MHUD) will enable 12 families to benefit from the home-ownership model.

We received building consent in mid-January and the site has been prepared for the building process - topsoil is cleared and levelled, surveyors measured the pads and they were formatted.

The deadline for applications for home ownership was 28th January 2022 – we received 88 applications and our Family Selection Team is now reviewing them and will select 12 lucky families by the end of March 2022!



Through the 2021 partnership with Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology (NMIT), three homes for whānau in need are being built in the Nelson region. NMIT's pre-trade students have been busy last year at the Richmond campus building spacious and modern, albeit affordable houses that Habitat Nelson will relocate, providing decent homes to three lucky families through its housing programmes. *"The finishing touches are being added, and the Habitat for Humanity houses built by carpentry pre-trade students are ready to be shifted to their new location, with the last items to be completed once the homes are located onsite," says Wayne Jackson, CEO of NMIT. <i>"It was the biggest project the construction staff had undertaken."* Traditionally the students have built one house, but in 2021 they took on three, three-bedroom houses for Habitat Nelson. *"While that presented a challenge with additional materials and space required, there was also a larger cohort of 48 students available to complete the project,"* Wayne mentions.

The location is not yet finalised but will be announced early this year. "We are working hard to secure a place where we can move these houses and start the process of looking for whānau that need a roof over their head that they can call home," confirms Nick Clarke, General Manager of Habitat for Humanity Nelson.

25th Anniversary of Habitat Nelson

Abitat for Humanity (Nelson) was established in 1996 by Julian Shields, a Nelson local. Since then, it has helped 26 families to purchase their own home in Nelson, Riwaka and Motueka. During this time a large amount of expertise was provided by local trades and builders, including the NZ Army, Australian Volunteers, Canadian Volunteers and American Global Village volunteers. Julian was on site of his last and Habitat Nelson's 24th house, at the age of 78.

2021 in review

There are 2 active partner families in the PHO programme (currently starting their 5-year renting journey) and 4 families that purchased their homes from Habitat Nelson in 2021. As well as the home ownership houses, there are 5 active social rentals – including an emergency house which is managed by the Salvation Army Nelson.)

Plans 2022-2026

n the last year, demand for the current PHO programme has increased 10-fold. Families want to get out of the vicious circle of expensive rentals with insecure tenure and create a stable home they can call their own. Planning is underway for 30 new homes with more in the pipeline. As well as the 14 homes at 623 Main Rd Stoke, 8 more homes are planned at 617 Main Rd, 5 in Richmond and 3 homes were built off-site by NMIT students, waiting to be transferred to their new sites.
